

NRCC Futurity Ring Race (*RPRA Licence Applied For*)

Rules

The race shall be open to any member of the NRCC and any RPRA Affiliated member flying 475 miles or more from Lerwick (Code 4057)

All birds eligible for the race must be rung with a 2022 Futurity Ring supplied by the secretary of the North Road Championship Club.

Futurity rings are £5 each, a maximum of 5 rings can be purchased per loft.

All birds rung with a futurity ring must be offered for sale on a 'social media platform' for it to be activated.

Only by entering your bird in one of the sales will your 'futurity ring' be activated for the race and entitled to any prizes in the race.

All birds entered into the race must be competing from 'any RPRA Affiliated member' whose loft is situated south of a line 475 miles from Lerwick.

The race will be divided into two sections; Section 1, shall be west of longitude 0.05.00W and section 2 shall be east of longitude 0.05.00W .

Minimum bid on all birds in the sale shall be £20, any fancier may buy their own birds back and purchased with every intention of being raced in the said race.

The prize money shall be generated by ring sales and monies from the sale of birds and split equally between the two sections, less conveying expenses.

There shall be three marking stations these being Norfolk, Wyberton and Nottingham, with birds brought in to a central collection point.

There is no charge for the marking of pigeons or race entry fee.

The race shall take place from Dunbar (Code 4153) on Saturday 17th September 2022, or the next available day if held over due to inclement weather.

The birds will be liberated on their own.

The race to close at 440ypm.

All fanciers first clocked pigeons must be verified on the NRCC Verification Service phone number within one hour of timing.

Winning pigeons shall be verified by an NRCC appointed person.

Prize monies will be distributed at the NRCC Presentation.
